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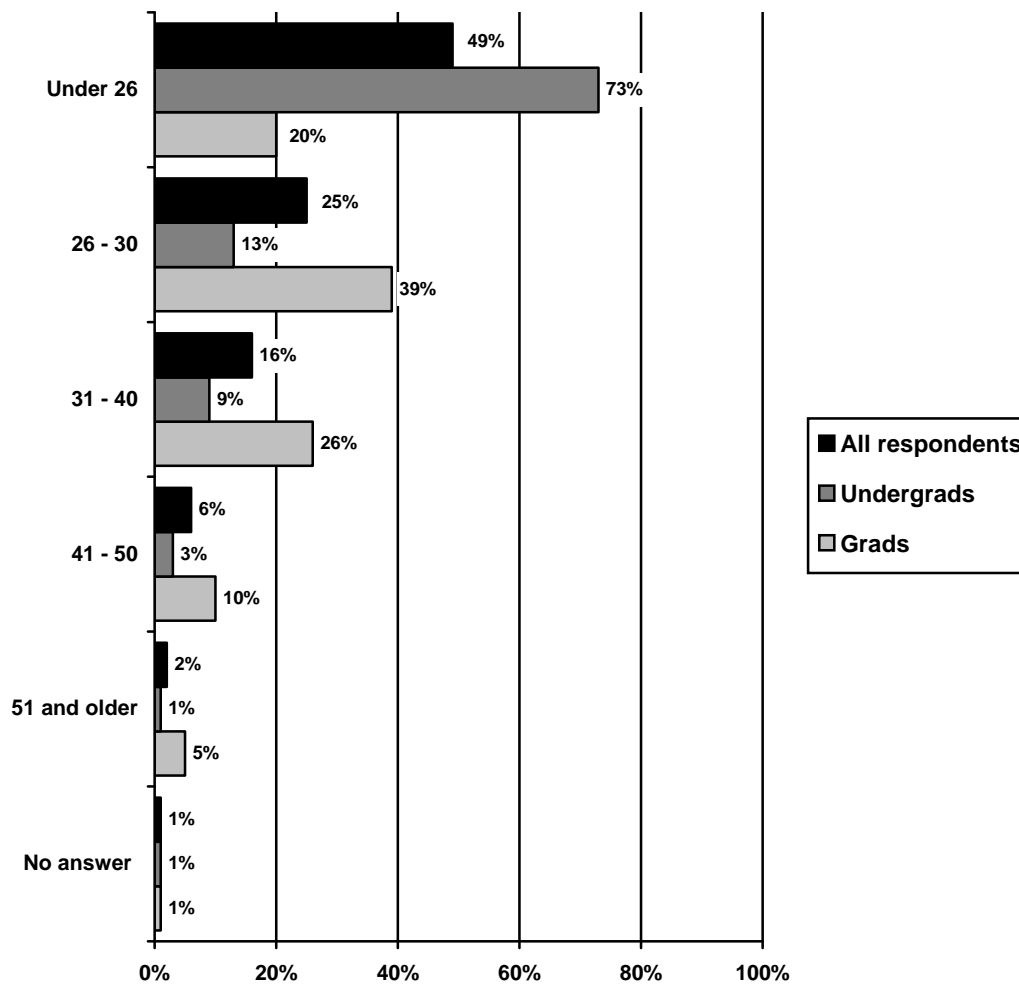
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- Introduction

An online survey was completed by graduating students in accredited undergraduate and graduate landscape architecture programs. The purpose of this survey was to gather information on post-graduation plans. The survey was similar to studies done annually since 1997, although this was only the third year it was conducted online. The results are summarized in the following report.

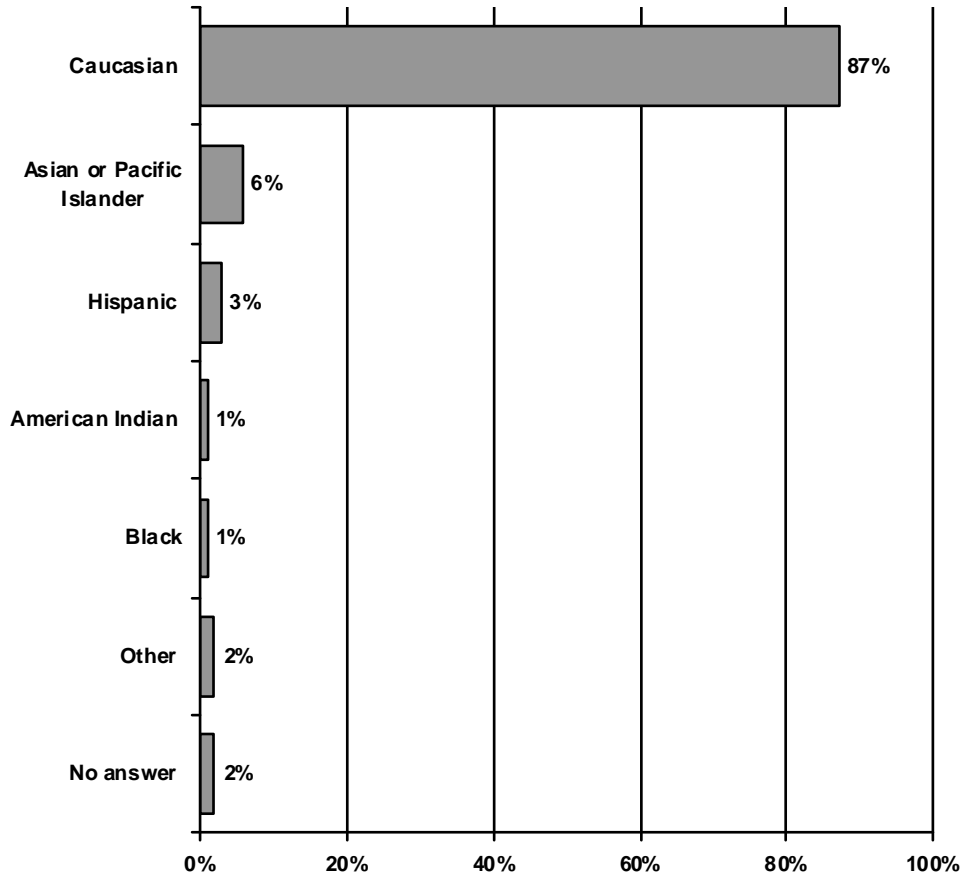
- Age

The average age of respondents is 26 for undergraduates, 32 for graduate students, and 28 overall. This is similar to last year.



- Race

The majority of respondents (87%) indicate that they are Caucasian.

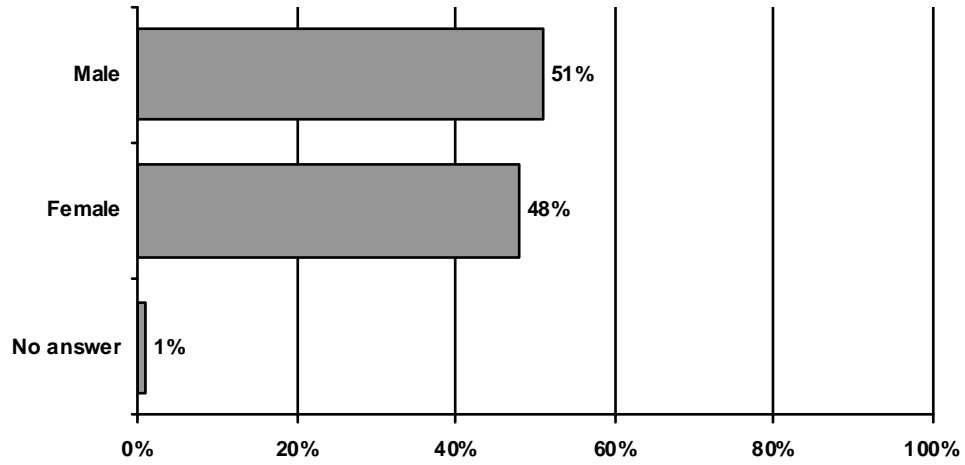

- Gender

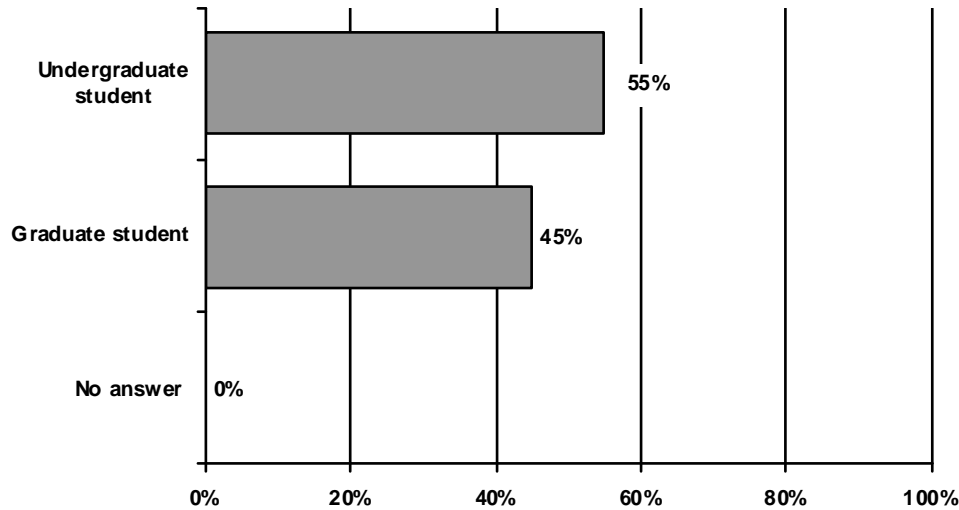
Just over one-half of respondents (51%) are male, while 48% are female.



The gender gap has narrowed since 2008, when there were 55% male students and 45% female.

- **Current Educational Status**

Out of 245 respondents, 135 (55%) are undergraduate students, and 110 (45%) are graduate students. This is a more even distribution than last year, where undergraduate students represented 69% of respondents and graduate students 31%.

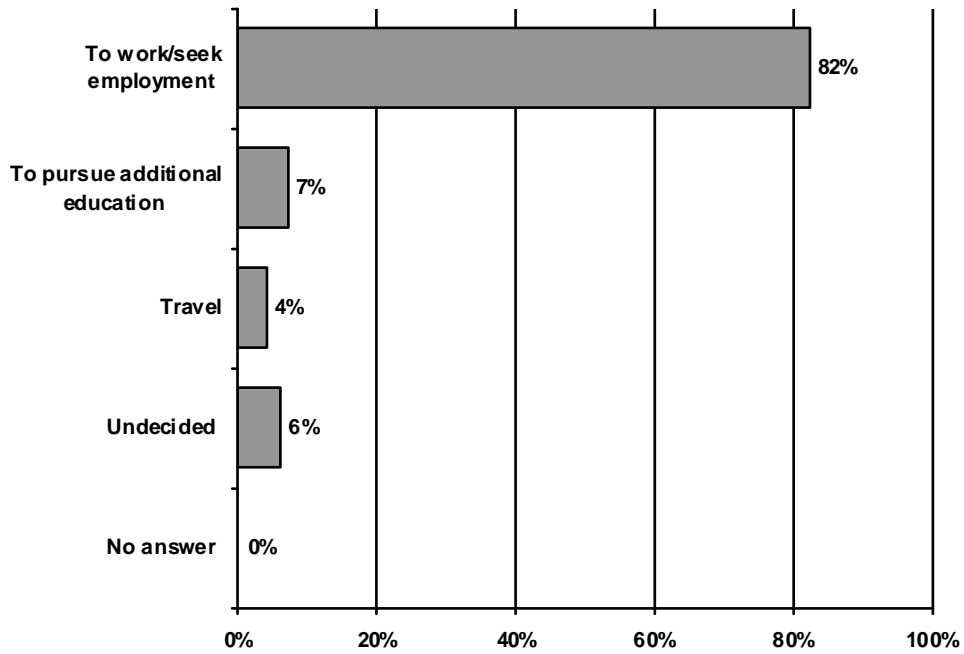

Graduate students report a variety of undergraduate degrees, led by Landscape Architecture/Design (13 mentions), Fine art (11 mentions), Architecture (9 mentions), Environmental Studies (6 mentions), Horticulture and Liberal arts (5 mentions each).

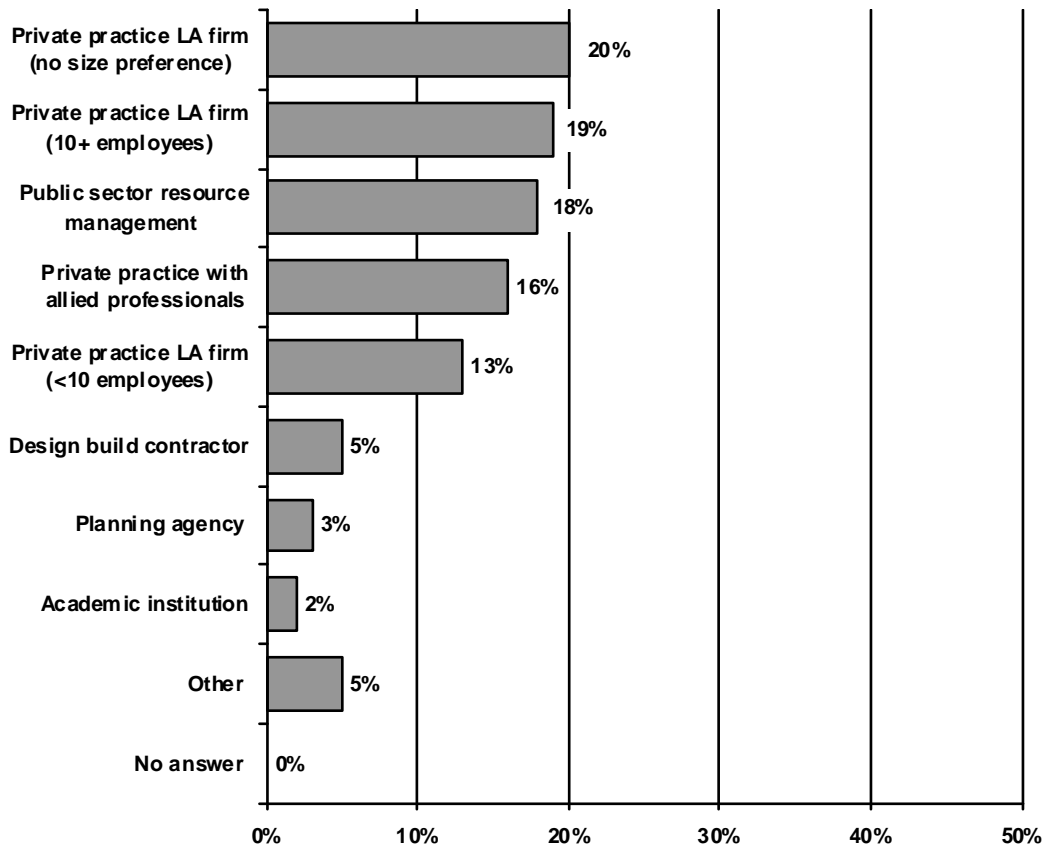
Plans for Immediate Future

Most respondents (82%) indicate that their plans for the immediate future involve either working or seeking employment, while 7% plan to pursue additional education, 4% plan to travel, and 6% are undecided. This represents a slight decrease in the percentage of respondents working or seeking work.



- Desired Type of Employer

Two-fifths of respondents (39%) indicate that they are primarily interested in seeking employment in a private practice LA firm, either any size (20%) or one with 10 or more employees (19%). Employers in public sector resource management (18%), private practice LA firms with allied professionals (16%), and private practices with less than ten employees (13%) follow.

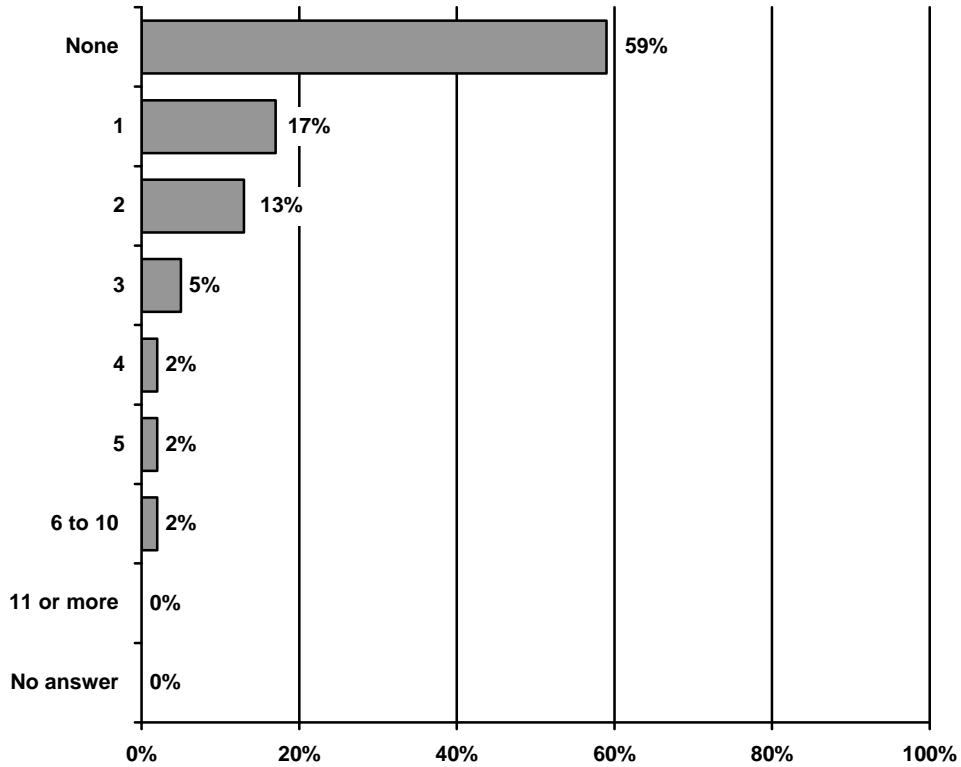

- Job Interviews

Respondents indicate that, on average, they have had approximately one job interview during their final semester in school, the same as last year’s average.

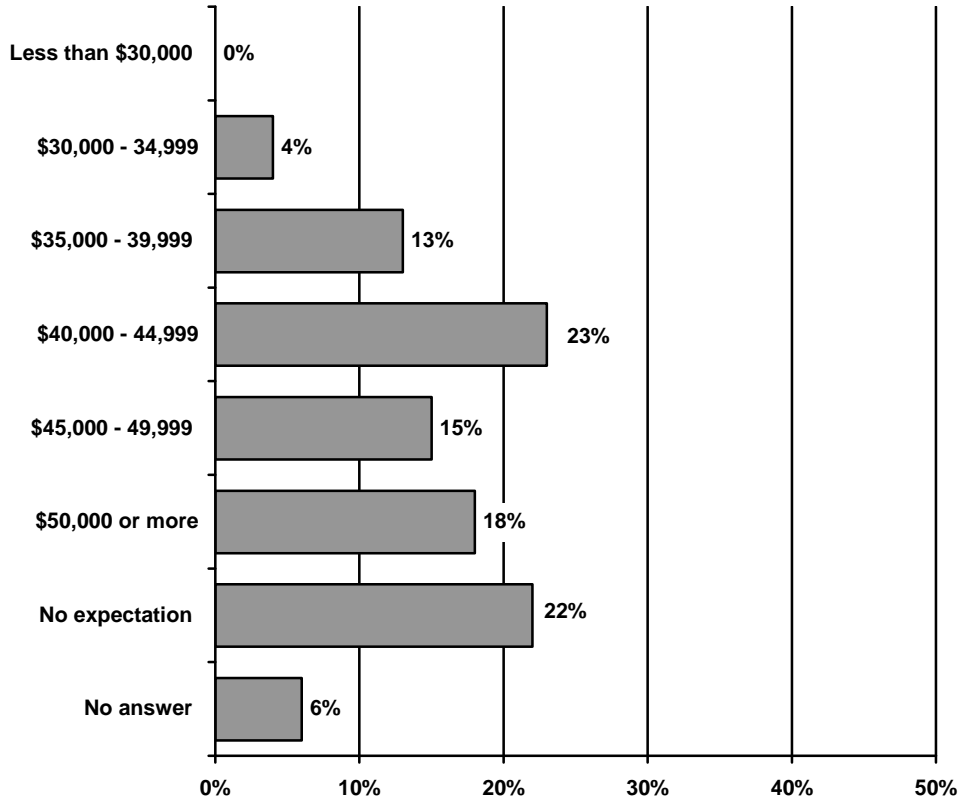


Respondents who have had one or more interviews were asked to comment on how the interview process went, if it was what they had expected, and anything noteworthy they encountered. A complete list of their comments may be found starting on page 42.

A majority of respondents (78%) indicate that the interview(s) went as expected, while 9% said it did not (and 13% didn’t indicate an answer). Their explanations can be found starting on page 46.

- Salary Expectations

Respondents who are looking for a job (or have already found one) expect(ed) an average salary of approximately \$43,500. Undergraduate students expect(ed) \$41,600 and graduate students expect(ed) \$45,600. This year's salary expectations stayed within \$900 (up or down) of last year's.



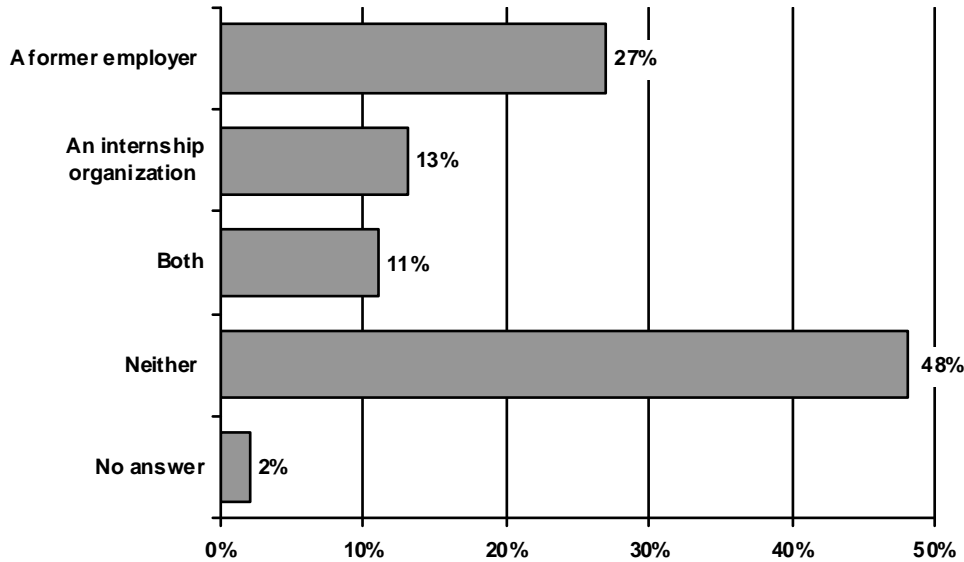

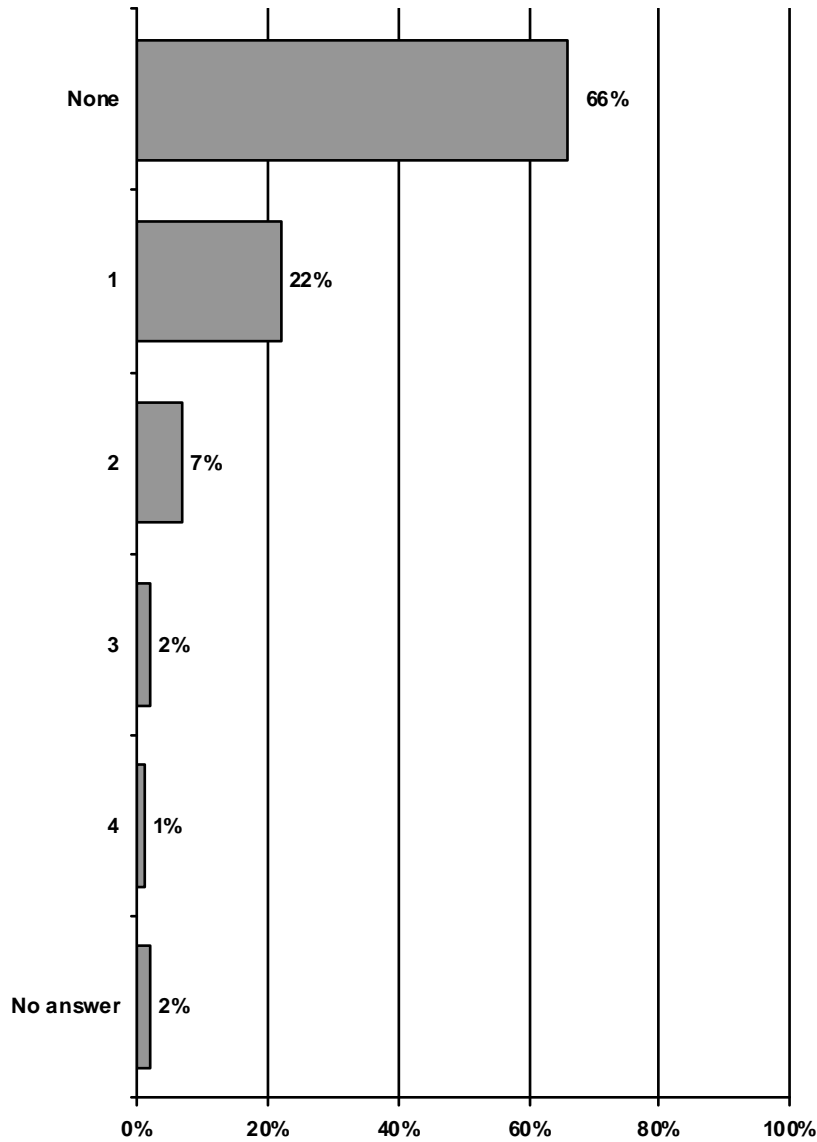
- **Employment Prospects**

More than one-quarter of respondents (27%) have or had reasonable employment prospects with a former employer, while 13% have/had prospects with an internship organization. These numbers are similar to last year's.



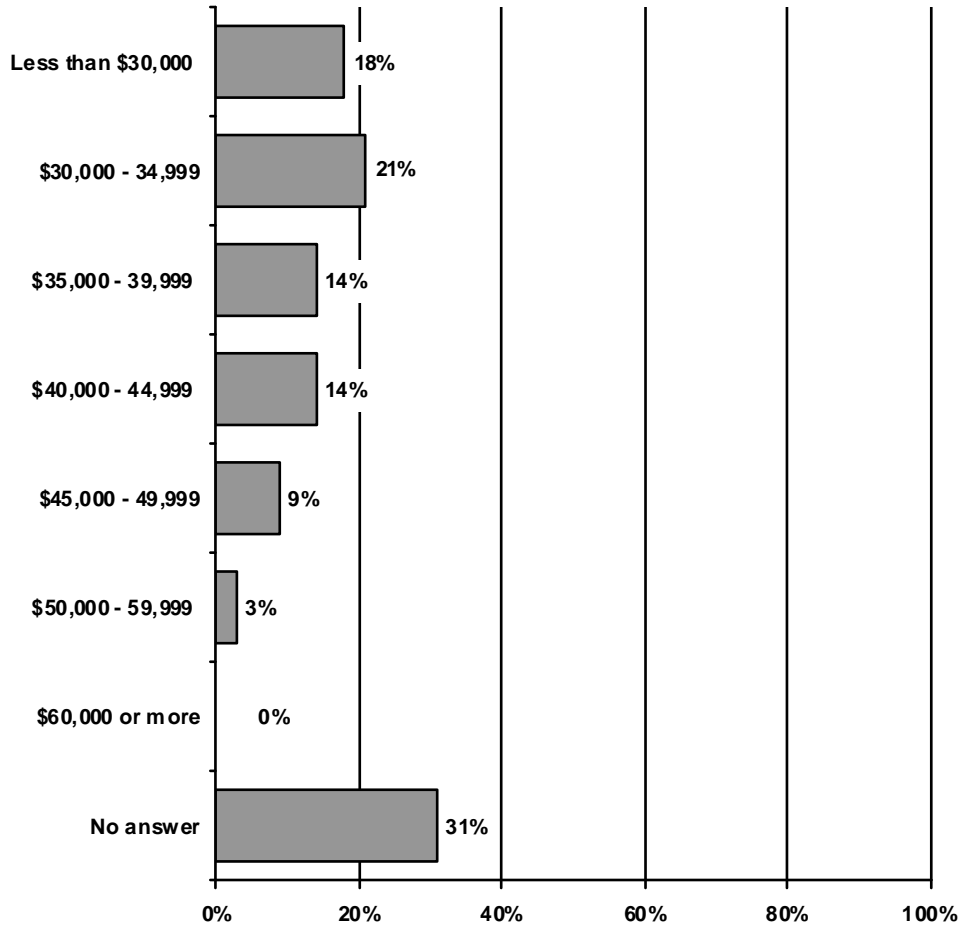
- Number of Job Offers

Respondents indicate that they had received, on average, less than one job offer at the time they completed the questionnaire, compared to one last year. The percentage of respondents receiving *at least* one job offer decreased by almost one-half (32% compared to 54%).



- Starting Salary Offered

The seventy-eight respondents who have had one or more job offers indicate that the average starting salary offered to them was approximately \$35,300.

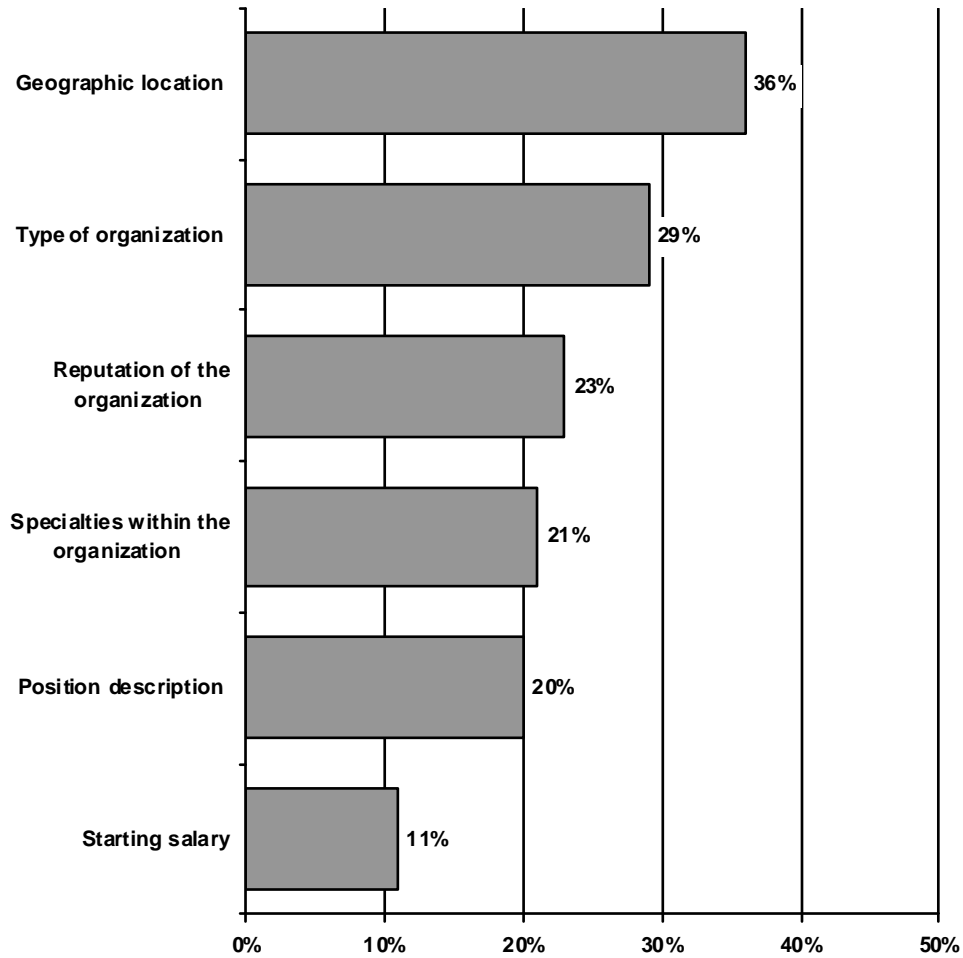

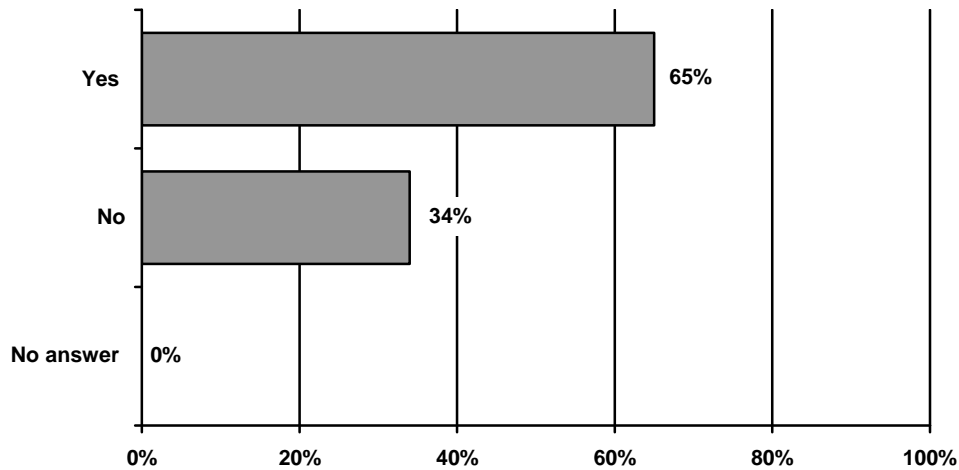
- **Important Factors in Job Selection**

Respondents were asked to rank a variety of attributes in order from '1' to '6' based on their importance to them in selecting a job. The following chart shows the percentage of respondents ranking a specific attribute number one. While percentages have changed from last year's, overall priorities are the same.



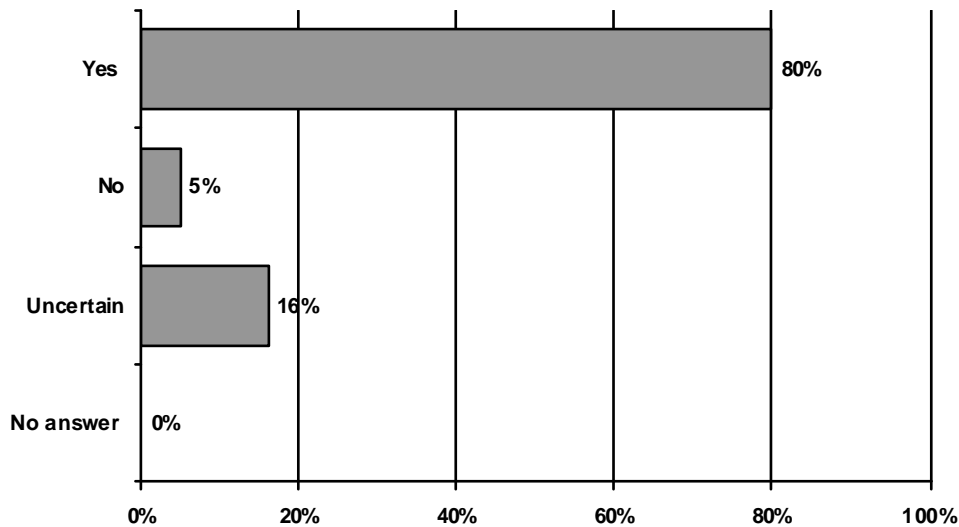
- **Geographical Restrictions**

Two-thirds of respondents (65%) indicate that, in their job search, they feel restricted to one geographical area for reasons of necessity or strong personal preference, while 34% do not feel restricted. This is similar to last year's responses.



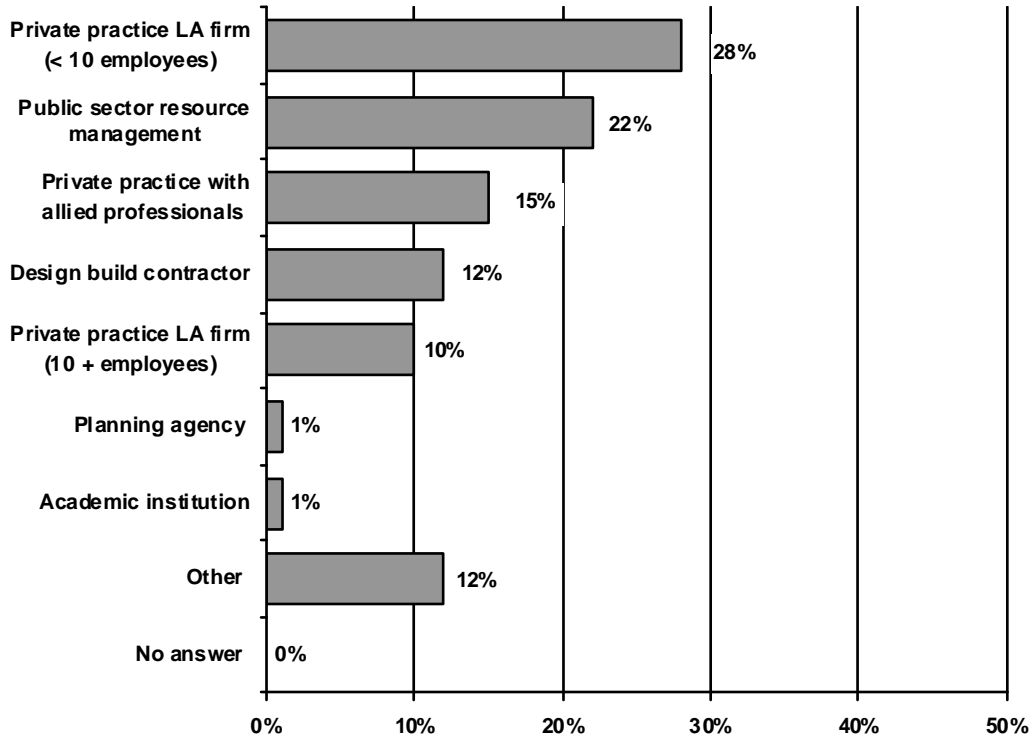
- **State Registration**

A majority of respondents (80%) indicate that they intend to seek state registration as a Landscape Architect. This is virtually the same response as last year's.



• **Type of Employer** [RESPONDENTS WHO HAVE STARTED OR ACCEPTED A JOB]

A total of sixty-nine respondents have started or accepted a job. More than one-quarter of these respondents (28%) describe their new employer as a private practice LA firm with 10 or more employees, while 22% describe their employer as public sector resource management (an increase of 20% from 2008).



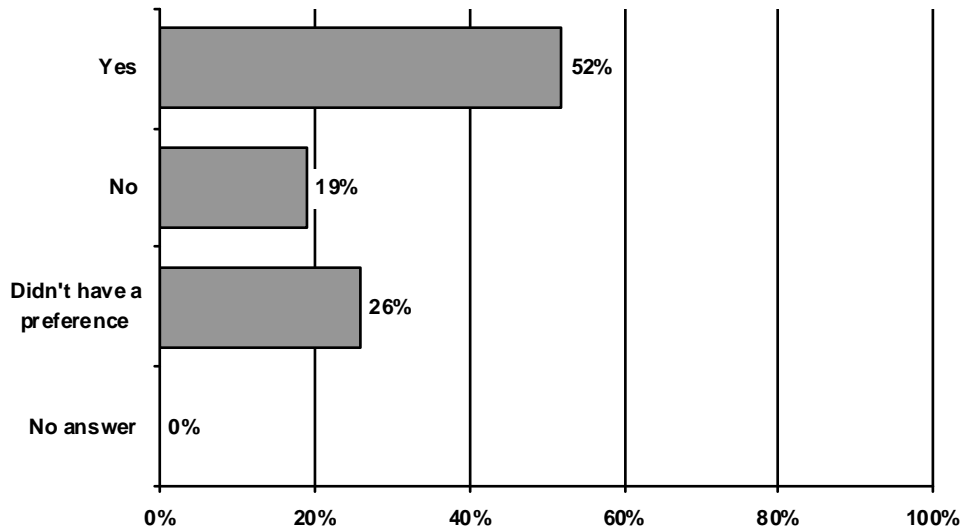

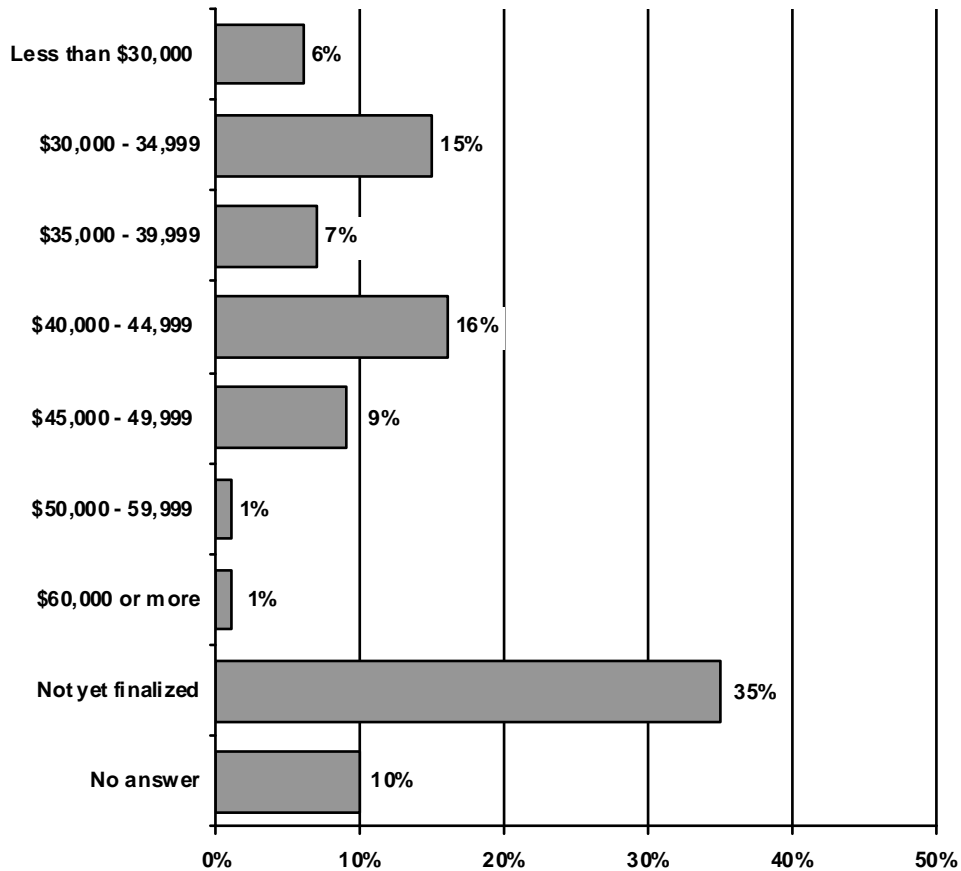
- Preferred Employer Type [RESPONDENTS WHO HAVE STARTED OR ACCEPTED A JOB]

Just slightly more than one-half of respondents (52%) who have accepted a job indicate that it is with their preferred type of employer, a good bit lower than last year's 70% of respondents who accepted a job with their preferred type of employer.



- Starting Salary [RESPONDENTS WHO HAVE STARTED OR ACCEPTED A JOB]

Among respondents who report that they have accepted a job offer, the average starting salary was approximately \$38,200. Undergraduate students report an average starting salary of approximately \$35,400 and graduate students report an average starting salary of approximately \$40,800.



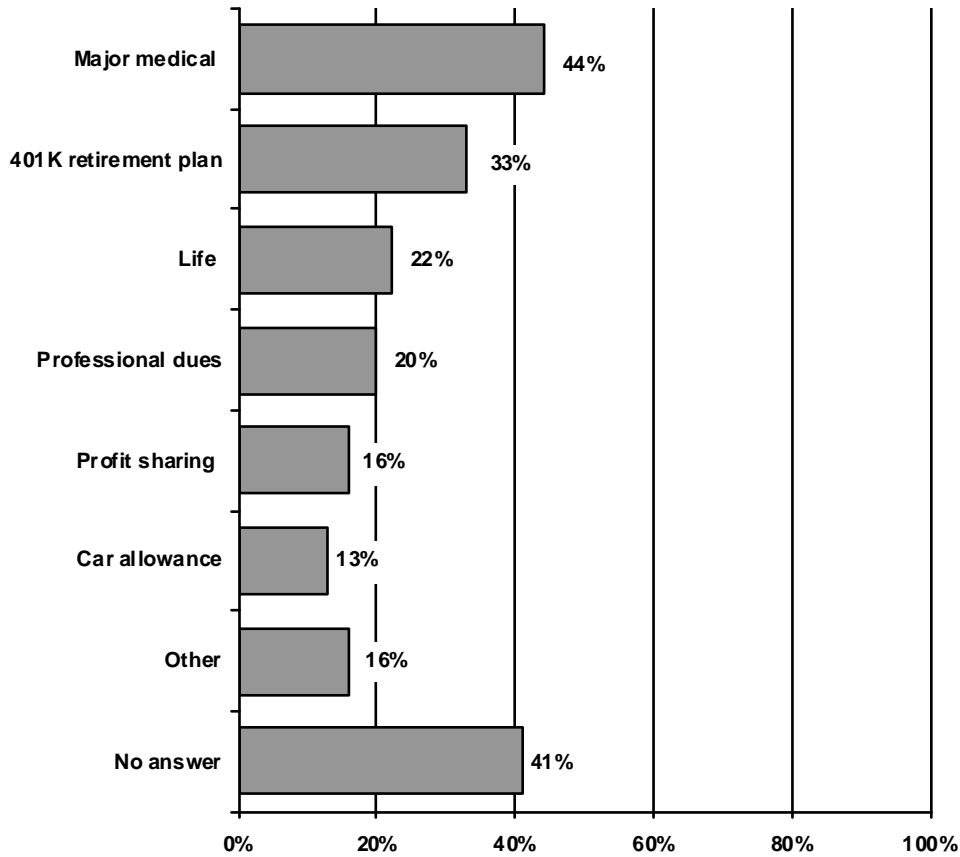

- **Benefits** [RESPONDENTS WHO HAVE STARTED OR ACCEPTED A JOB]

Respondents indicate that they have a variety of benefits included in their current job. At the top of the list are major medical (44%) and 401K retirement plan (33%).

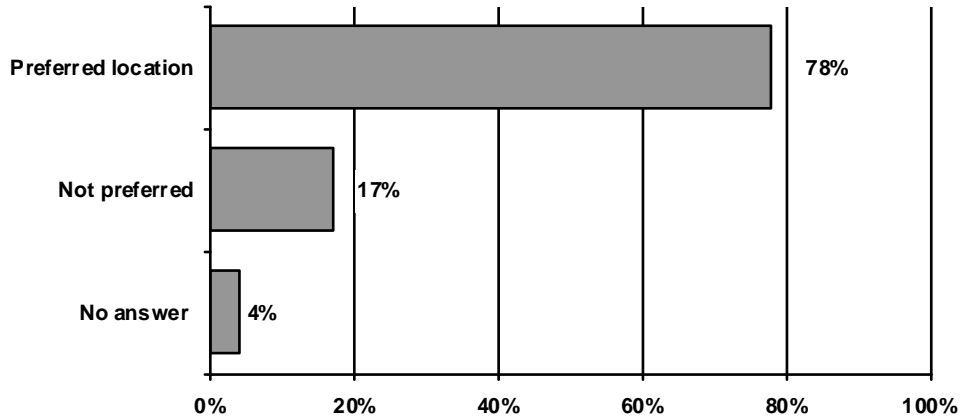

- **Location** [RESPONDENTS WHO HAVE STARTED OR ACCEPTED A JOB]

Respondents indicate that they will be working in a number of different states, with the largest groups in California (13%), Pennsylvania (7%), and Georgia, Kentucky, New Mexico, and New York (4% each).

Most respondents (78%) indicate that this is their preferred region. This is in line with last year (81%).



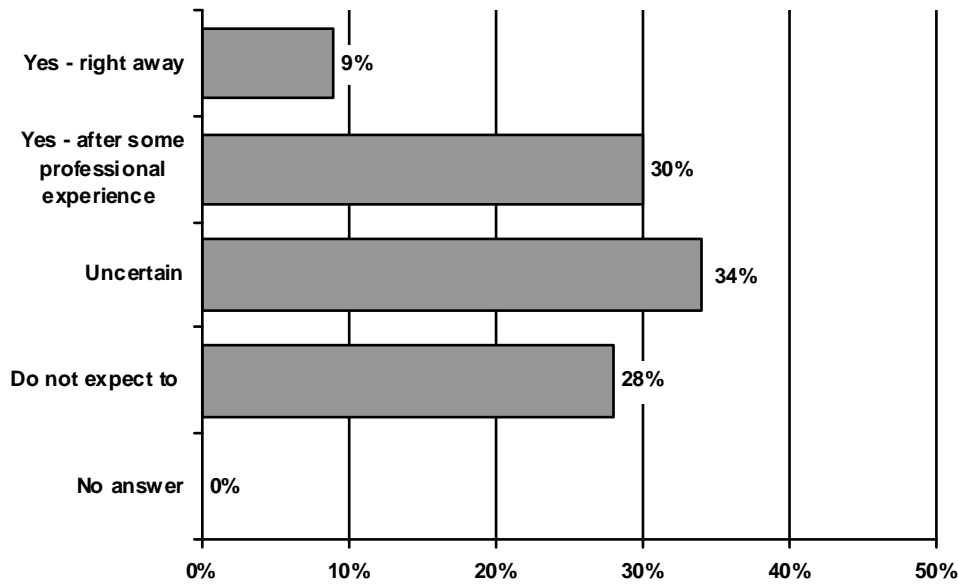
- **Summary Comparison of Job-Expectations with Recently Hired Respondents**

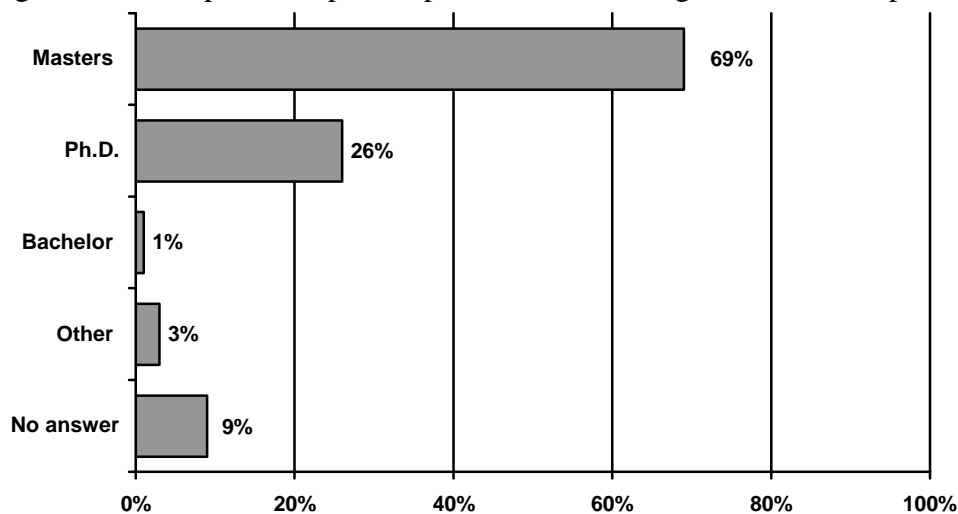

- **Additional Schooling**

Close to one-third of respondents (30%) anticipate pursuing another degree or additional education after some professional experience, while 34% may do so at some later point (uncertain), and 9% intend to do so right away.

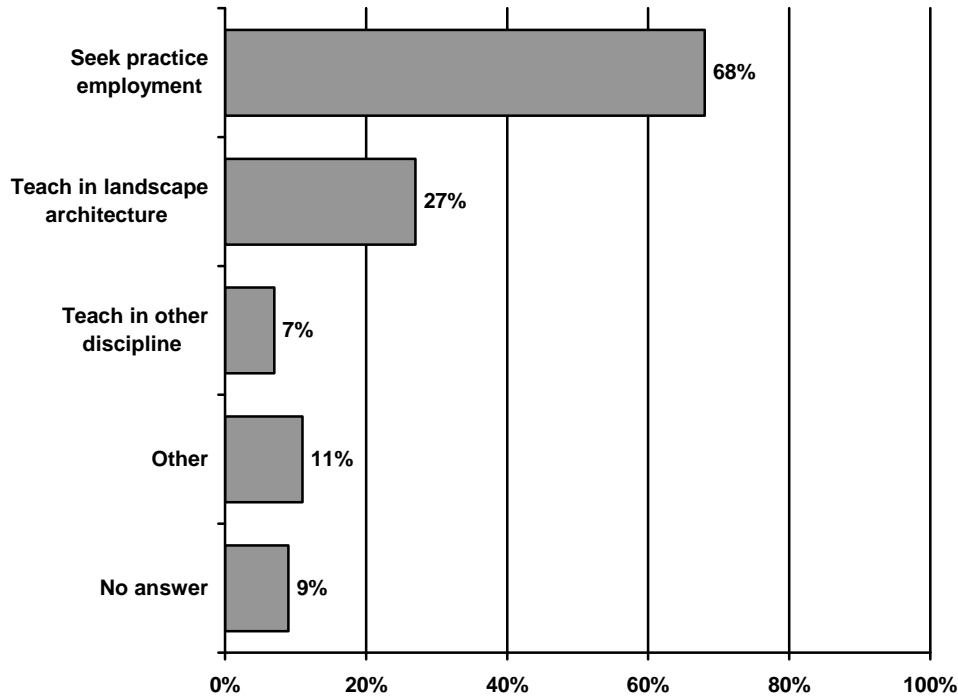


Of the respondents who are planning to pursue another degree, more than two-thirds (69%) indicate that it will be a Masters, while 26% will pursue a Ph.D., and 2% will pursue an additional Bachelor's Degree. Most respondents plan to pursue advanced degrees in Landscape Architecture or related areas.



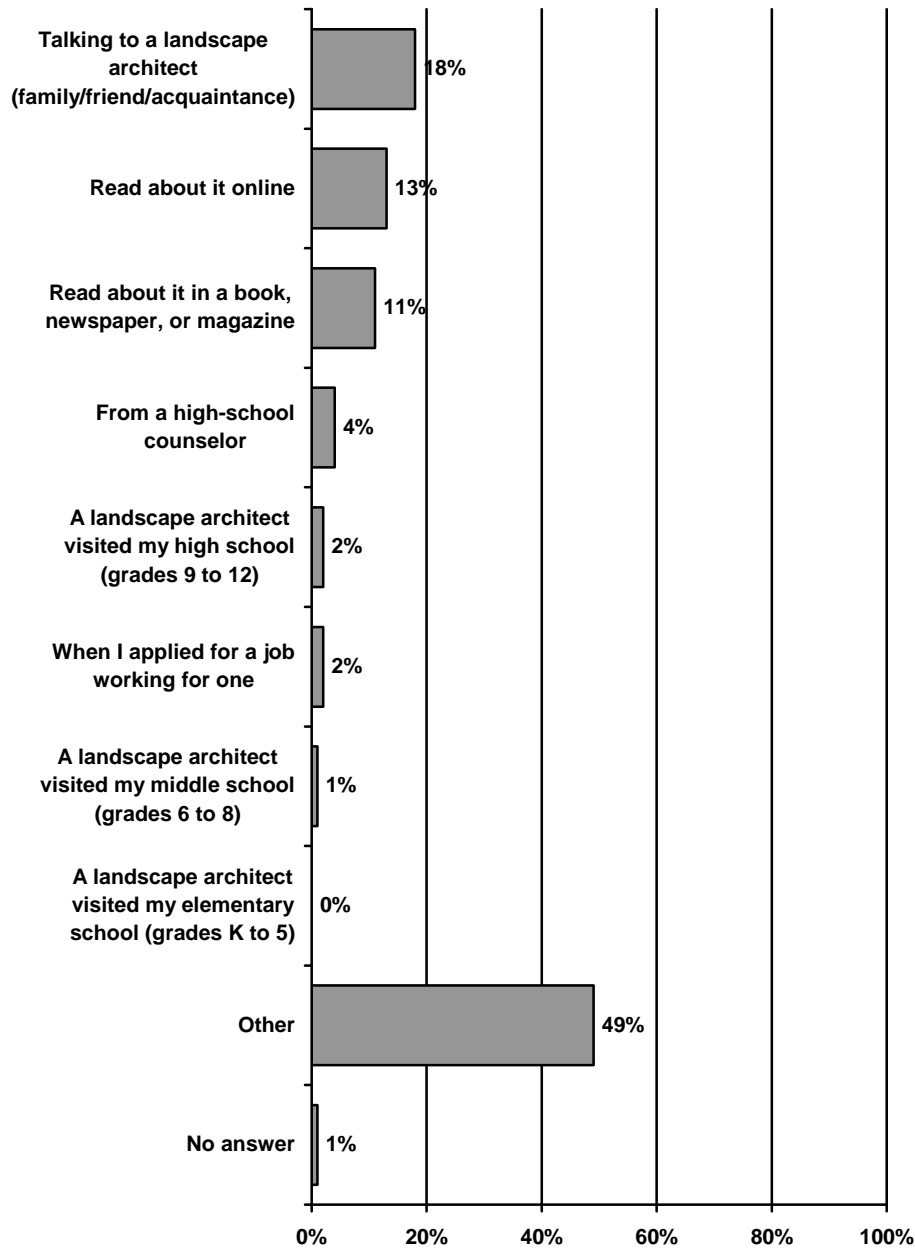
- **After Completing Additional Degree**

Close to two-thirds of respondents (68%) who plan to pursue another degree anticipate seeking practice employment once they have completed this degree, while 27% expect to teach in landscape architecture.



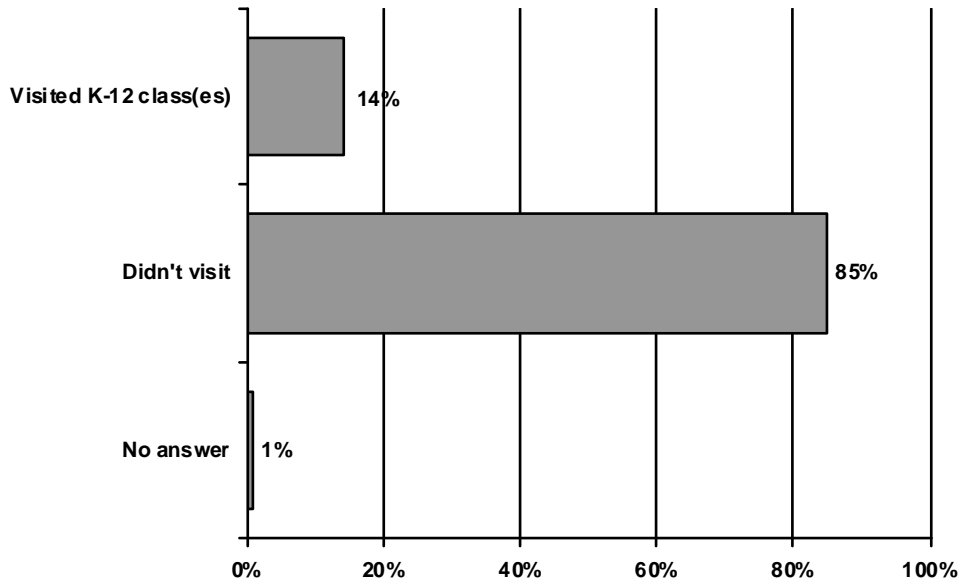
- Introduction to Profession

Respondents were most likely to have first learned about the landscape architecture profession from talking to one (18%), reading about it online (13%), or reading about it in a book, newspaper, or magazine (11%).

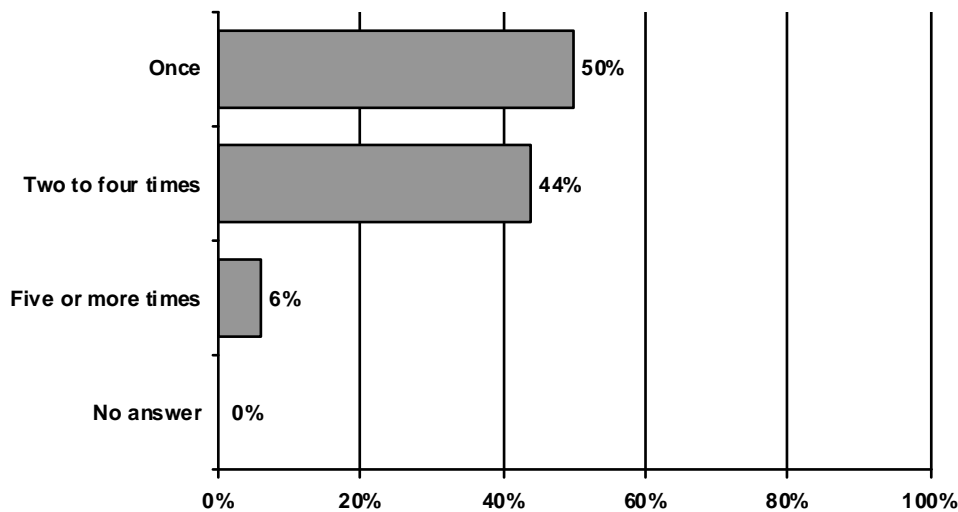


- **Sharing the Profession**

Most respondents (85%) did not visit an elementary, middle, or high school to talk about the profession while they were studying the subject.



Of the respondents who did participate in this type of activity, one-half (50%) made a single visit, and most of the rest (44%) made two to four visits.



These respondents visited high schools (56%), middle schools (29%), and elementary schools (41%).

q7b. Please comment on how the interview went:

- All three interviews were held over the phone, and all interviewers were exceptionally friendly and took the time to describe the potential position. As seniors we took a Professional Practice class where we held mock interviews to prepare for questions.
- Although it went well overall, I learned how I might rephrase, or approach certain answers differently in future interviews.
- Asked what my interests were. Told me about their business.
- difficult to locate potential employers, but good interview experiences
- Good
- Good, I got the job.
- Good. The interviewees were interested in me and expressed that I was highly qualified.
- Great!
- Great. I got the job right over the phone. Then the next phone conversation we had, I was given a promotion and small raise.
- Great. just a lot of people applying for the job
- I ended up interviewing with and accepting a job with a very small design build firm outside of Cincinnati. I was told that I will be working from 7am to 6pm during the summer and winter tasks may include answering calls for or even driving snow plows during snow storms. It was the only offer I received, so I took it.
- I got the job it's my second in the field
- I had sent my portfolio prior to the interview after I was referred by another firm. I brought a smaller portfolio for the interview to discuss minimally and we talked more about who I was as a person rather than as a potential employee so they could get to know my personality. They expressed that they were impressed with my academic work.
- I met all but one firm at a variety of career fairs on campus. The meetings and conversations that went well led to interviews and a visit to the firm.
- I met with two different firms at our schools design expo
- I think the process went well; however, many firms are more casual in their interviews than what I had expected.
- I was asked to interview based on merit. It was set-up as a preliminary interview to show work samples with additional interviews to be set-up once the job was opened to the public by University guidelines.
- I was extremely prepared for it due to my previous experiences in interviews. Though when talking about benefits I was somewhat confused due to the fact that I have never had benefits before and never have been thoroughly educated on them.
- Interview process went great, but several of them were mock interviews.
- Interviews for landscape architecture firms are surprisingly casual. It is more about both parties getting to know each other.
- interviews went very well...I felt confident/relaxed
- Interviews went well. Most firms said they are not hiring because of the economy but they will let me know if anything opens up
- It is scheduled for the Week of May 4th, therefore has not happened yet.

q7d. Please explain

- a small firm that does mainly residential design - just what I wanted
- As expected, a conversation about me, my portfolio and experiences, in addition to the firm, my job roles, and projects undertaken by the firm.
- Economy is tough right now.
- Firms are interviewing but there are no jobs available.
- I already knew the employer and so could well predict how the interview would go.
- I anticipated all the questions they asked me and expected to learn more about the company during the interview.
- I expected it to be a lot more intense. I had heard that the first entry level job interview is the most rigorous, but compared to my competitive internship interviews, it was a lot less structured.
- I expected that the economy would make it difficult to find a job given that most landscape architecture firms fail to get enough projects that are not tied to the housing/development market.
- I expected them to walk me around their firm so that I could get a feel for the overall atmosphere and the people that work there. I didn't go in expecting an offer at that time, so it was a great learning experience for me. I took advantage of interviewing with firms that I wasn't really that interested in just to gain experience and insight in the wide range of possibilities after graduation.
- I felt that my education had prepared me for what to expect.
- I had already been working for the University as a Graduate Research Assistant. They expressed interest in keeping me on as an employee and with the economy the way it is, I said sure.
- I knew before hand that the industry was in a tight bind for the past couple of months, my expectations were lowered. I am now planning to travel until September 2009, when one of the jobs is offered to start.
- I knew no one would be hiring because of the down economy but I wanted the interview practice anyway
