Dear Ms. Jacobson,

As the Trustee from Michigan, I am honored to nominate Mr. William Main to be named an Honorary Member of ASLA for his endless support of landscape architecture.

Bill Main has been an active supporter from the late 1970's with most of his career spent in the management and ownership of Landscape Forms. Landscape Forms has been a leader in the development of site furnishings that have been integrated into projects worldwide. He has led his firm with sincerity to be creative and to respond to our design trends and ideas.

Bill Main joined Landscape Forms in 1985 as National Sales Manager. He assumed full marketing responsibilities soon after. Mr. Main was named General Manager in 1989 and went on to become President of Landscape Forms in 1993.

He is a member of the board of directors at Thomson-Shore, Inc. Thomson-Shore is a leading printer of short run books located in Dexter, Michigan.

In 1996 and 1997, Mr. Main served as Chairman of the Scanlon Leadership Network. He has also served on the Scanlon Board for several years. The Scanlon Leadership Network is a non-profit association developed from the innovative work of Joseph Scanlon during the 1940s and 1950s. As a staff member of the United Steelworkers of America, Scanlon believed that a company's health and survival required a climate of cooperation rather than competition between labor and management. He used his ideas to improve productivity, thereby saving many organizations and jobs. He not only pioneered employee involvement, he was one of the early developers of gain sharing. The Scanlon Leadership Network of companies share a corporate culture rooted in the Scanlon Principles of Identity, Participation, Competence, and Equity. Scanlon Principles have been helping Landscape Forms grow and prosper since they were adopted in 1981.

After Bill Main earned a Bachelor of Landscape Architecture degree from Michigan State University in 1975, he worked as a landscape contractor for eight years. He then returned to Michigan State University and earned a Master of Business Administration in Marketing in 1983.

Landscape Forms, Inc. is one of the world's premier designers and manufacturers of outdoor commercial furnishings. Founded in 1969 and headquartered in Kalamazoo, Michigan, the Landscape Forms message focuses on:

- expertise in the development of public space;
- belief in the power of design and its ability to influence and elevate the quality of public space;
- high quality products that last; and
- timely, friendly and efficient customer service

The company is a recognized as a leader in the industry for its creative designs and durable commercial-grade site furnishings. Products include exterior seating systems, benches, tables

and chairs, umbrellas, wheelchair-accessible picnic tables, planters, litter receptacles and ash urns.

As a result of its focus on design, Landscape Forms has won several design awards over the years. Most recently, Landscape Forms' Arcata bench was honored with a Silver IDEA award in the 2001 Industrial Design Excellence Awards (IDEA) competition sponsored by the Industrial Designers Society of America (IDSA) and *Business Week* magazine. Other awards include a gold award, Best of NeoCon and a gold IDEA for the Solstice Sun Shade design; a silver award, Best of NeoCon for the Equinox Umbrella; and two bronze IDEA awards for the Hyde Park Bench and Carousel Table designs.

Recently Landscape Forms completed a two-year study co-sponsored with frog design, which resulted in a White Paper titled *Creating the Built Environment: Issues and Trends in Design.* More than two hundred high-profile practitioners in the design professions were invited to share perspectives on big issues in design. They were architects, landscape architects, planners, interior designers, writers and editors, academics, local government officials and representatives of professional organizations. The exchanges took place in fifteen cities at roundtables as part of their research for a new collection of site furniture products. The findings from the sessions proved so valuable that the sponsors gifted them to the Landscape Architecture Foundation for distribution to students. The White Paper is available to any interested individual.

Landscape Forms has placed a strong emphasis on the importance of educating students enrolled in the landscape architecture curriculum and makes frequent presentations to student chapters of ASLA, emphasizing the importance of design and its impact on individuals and communities. These programs have been a feature of student life at Michigan State University for over 20 years.

The ASLA official publication, *Landscape Architecture*, has been a vital element in Landscape Forms' marketing communications plan. A five-year relationship with the magazine has included a monthly full-page, four-color ad. In addition, extra space has been added to the contract for 2005 as part of Landscape Forms' launch plan for a new line of products. Other contracts with the magazine have included adding clear plastic bags of product literature to the subscriber distributions.

Landscape Forms has supported other ASLA initiatives including sponsorship of guest speakers at ASLA annual conventions, underwriting portions of professional meeting activities and special sponsorships of activities at the conventions. The company has also been one of the larger exhibitors at the annual EXPO for the past ten years.

In addition to gifting the White Paper to the Landscape Architecture Foundation, the LAF has been the recipient of special funding from Landscape Forms for a number of years. Landscape Forms has also served as a sponsor of a number of LAF's special events.
