Re: Nomination of Reed Hilderbrand for the 2013 Landscape Architecture Firm Award

Dear Trustees:

It gives me great pleasure to nominate one of the most distinguished and successful firms of our generation, Reed Hilderbrand, for your consideration for the 2013 Landscape Architecture Firm Award.

Since 1997, the collaborative work of Doug Reed, FASLA, Gary Hilderbrand, FASLA, and their talented colleagues has raised the profile of landscape architecture across our nation and around the world.

Their firm is part of the third wave of postwar landscape design, which is to say that the work embodies a confident awareness of history and ecological concerns while consistently expanding the parameters of classical modernism. These gardens, parks, plazas, and campuses have been conceived and constructed at the highest level of landscape work being produced today.

Reed Hilderbrand is universally admired for its designs and for the craftsmanship of the projects they produce, as well as for their extraordinary use of plants, the value they place on a landscape's palimpsest, and pioneering sustainable practices. Though they hail from vastly different parts of the country, Doug and Gary share a passion for landscapes, history, and cities, a love of abstract expressionism and contemporary sculpture, and an appetite for modernism in all its dimensions.

After a partnership with Susan Child, FASLA, which produced award-winning work, Doug opened his own firm in 1993. After several years of practice and immersion in the history of our discipline, Gary took a consulting position with Dr. Cynthia Zaitzevsky in the analysis of Frederick Law Olmsted's Boston Park System and alterations over its first one hundred years. In 1990 he began teaching in Harvard's design studios and technology courses. He

has continued to teach there since and has published two books and more than 20 essays on design theory and practice. After they joined forces to produce the winning design in an invited competition for a new shrub and vine collection at the Arnold Arboretum of Harvard University, they combined forces.

With this and other commissions that followed—for the renowned Mount Auburn Cemetery in Cambridge, Massachusetts, the Hobart Urban Nature Preserve in Ohio, and several adaptive projects on Boston's Christian Science Plaza—Reed Hilderbrand gained experience in making precise and sensitive interventions within publicly accessible places where design heritage mattered.

During the growth economy of the late 1990s and the resurgent boom years of post-9/11 America, the firm broadened its portfolio beyond the New England/New York region to Ohio, Pennsylvania, Virginia, Texas, Arizona, the Carolinas, and beyond. Complexity became the norm: campus projects with telescoping scales and long durations, urban parks on postindustrial sites; and larger urban revitalization and infrastructure schemes conceived for implementation over many years or even decades.

The firm is incredibly prolific in a wide range of work, from residential to parks, and cultural to academic institutions. In just the past decade, the firm's work has garnered eight national ASLA awards, as well as recognition from many other national and regional organizations.

The firm's work has influenced landscape architecture firms across our nation. It is timely and fitting that we recognize Reed Hilderbrand with the Landscape Architecture Firm Award.
